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PLEASE KEEP THE FOLLOWING IN MIND:

- **BOLD** course numbers mean that, that course can be “double-dipped,” meaning that the course will fulfill more than one requirement.
 - You can only double-dip two courses between areas CA 1, CA 2, and CA 3 into CA 4.
 - Only one course from CA 2 can be used to double-dip into CA 4.
 - CA 1 is the only area where 2 courses can be double-dipped into CA 4.
- If a course is offered also as both a W course and a non-W course, then either will satisfy the requirement.
 - Courses with both options will be indicated with a “/” before the W.
- If a course has a “**” after the number, it means that knowledge of a foreign language is required.
 - This course will either have a foreign language as a pre-requisite or will be taught in a foreign language.
- Courses in CA 1, 2, & 3 must be taken in at least 6 different academic units.
- Students must complete ALL content areas and competencies to fulfill the CLAS general education requirement.
